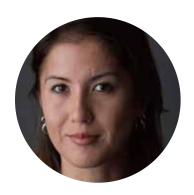

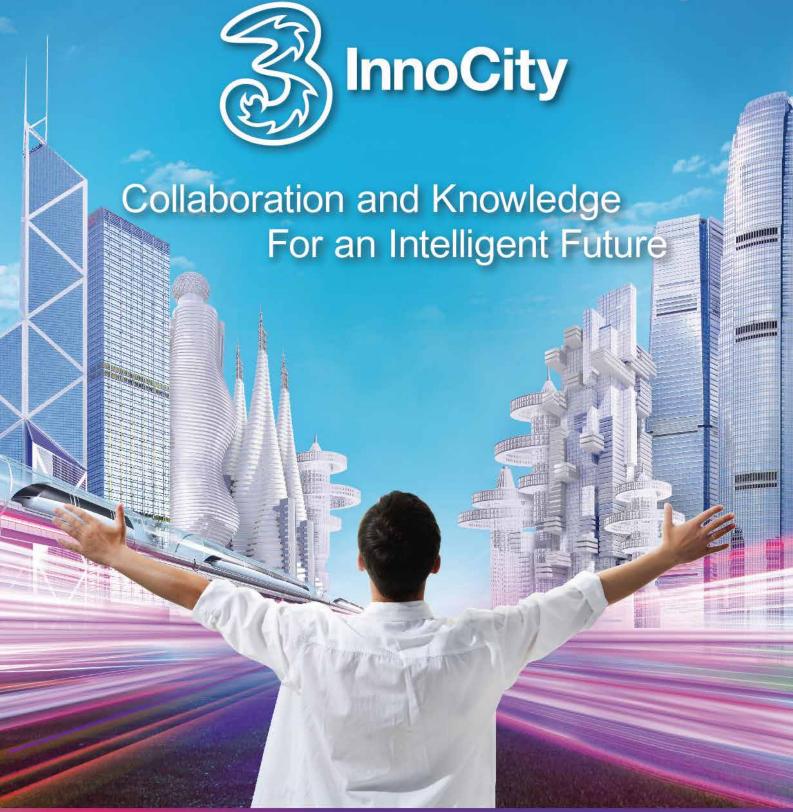

Message from Editorial Chair and Head of Judges

ournalists, or at least editors, love anniversary stories and the SOPA Awards have a great story to tell on their 20th anniversary. It's hard to imagine now, but when the Awards began back in 1998, news organizations were just taking their first steps onto the internet, with most simply duplicating the content of their print products online. It was perhaps an inauspicious year to be born: a year of the Tiger that saw the tiger economies of Asia humbled in a regional financial crisis. But it was a great time to be a journalist in Asia. And ever since then, geopolitical events, not least China's stunning rise since joining the World Trade Organization in 2001, have provided ample fodder for outstanding journalism in the region, while the rapid spread of the internet has presented new opportunities - and pitfalls - for publishers of digital online news.

The SOPA Awards have kept pace with the news and with the changes. In 2006, new categories were added to honour excellence in reporting breaking news and major scoops; three years later, the first category to recognize excellence in digital journalism was created, in addition to honours for infographics and investigative journalism. An award for excellence in reporting on women's issues was added in 2014, to encourage better and wider coverage of the half of the region's population that is too frequently overlooked in the news.

It's been a tumultuous 20 years but, in all that time, one thing hasn't changed: the positive impact that quality journalism can have on people's lives. The efforts of a team of Reuters journalists over the past year to reveal the brutal campaign of ethnic cleansing by Myanmar's security forces against the Rohingya helped, in the words of the United Nations, to save lives. Those journalists, including Wa Lone who was jailed by the Myanmar government for his work, have been nominated for this year's inaugural SOPA Award for Public Service Journalism. It's also doubtful Malaysia's first peaceful handover of power to an opposition party, just last month, would have happened without the untiring efforts of journalists both within and beyond Malaysia, including SOPA 2016 Journalist of the Year Tom Wright of The Wall Street Journal.

Here's hoping that will never change. And those of us involved in the SOPA Awards will continue to do what we can to ensure it never does.

Maria A. Ressa - CEO and Executive Editor of Rappler

M

aria A. Ressa is the CEO and Executive Editor of Rappler, a social news network which uses a hearts and minds approach to news through a unique mood navigator. Rappler combines the best of professional journalism with citizen journalism and crowdsourcing.

Ms. Ressa has been a journalist in Asia for more than 30 years, most of them as CNN's bureau chief in Manila (1987-1995) then Jakarta (1995-2005). She was CNN's lead investigative reporter focusing on terrorism in Southeast Asia and wrote "Seeds of Terror: An Eyewitness Account of al-Qaeda's Newest Center of Operations in Southeast Asia" (Free Press, 2003).

In 2005, she took the helm of ABS-CBN News and Current affairs, for six years determining strategic direction and managing more than 1,000 journalists for the largest multi-platform news operation in the Philippines. Her work aimed to redefine journalism by combining traditional broadcast, new media and mobile phone technology for social change.

She taught courses in Politics and the Press in Southeast Asia for her alma mater, Princeton University and in broadcast journalism for the University of the Philippines. She worked on her second book, "From Bin Laden to Facebook" as Author-in-Residence and Senior Fellow at the International Centre for Political Violence & Terrorism Research in Singapore. She is also the Southeast Asia Visiting Scholar at CORE Lab at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California.

She has designed and taught courses for the Hong Kong Police, the Independent Commission Against Corruption, and companies such as Goldman Sachs, Richemont Group, and Swire Properties. Karen has lived in Sydney, Singapore, London and Hong Kong and is married with three sons.

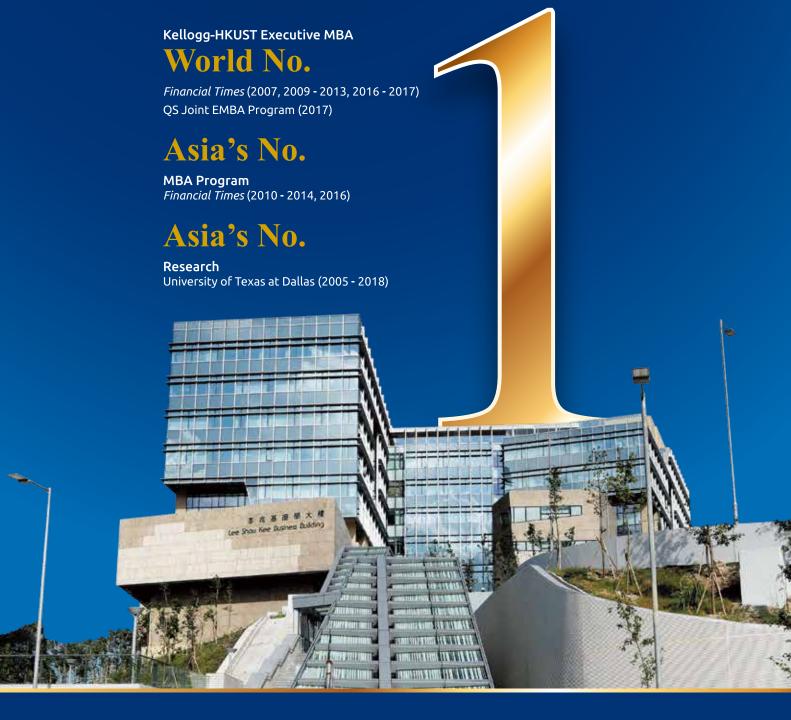

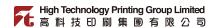
